

Attire: Although formal attire is worn by a great majority of students, a tux and formal dress are not required for admittance to the Prom. There is an expectation that students should refrain from wearing clothing that is revealing or not in good taste. CWCS is not responsible for lost or stolen items. If a student's attire becomes a nuisance, the student will be asked to change, or asked to leave the Prom.

Note: There will be no in/out privileges. Once Prom attendees sign out to leave, they will not be allowed re-admittance.

Prom Rules and Expectations *Let's make it enjoyable for everyone*

Chaperones will be in attendance all evening. Students will be chaperoned until they are picked up or leave. Parents are welcome anytime to check in and snap a picture or two.

The Prom will be held at the Elkhorn Country Club and Golf Course. Students will not be allowed on the greens of the golf course, and may not loiter in the parking lot or on Country Club premises outside of the Garden Room.

This will be a drug/alcohol/gang free Prom. No beverages of any sort, including water or any container which may hold a beverage, may be brought into the Prom. As is the case at all school functions, chaperones at the Prom will enforce Board of Education policy throughout the evening. (See parent/student handbook) All school rules will be in effect. If anyone attending Prom is suspected of consuming alcohol, drugs, or engaging in gang signs/activity, their parents will be called and requested that they come to the prom site and pick up the student. If this method does not work, the police will be notified and custody of the students will be turned over to them. If students attempt to leave, the police will be notified and be provided the names and any other identification needed to cover liability for the safety of the student and other drivers on the road at that time. Any student or guest who refuses a directive of a chaperone or administrator will be asked to leave. Participation in Graduation

ceremonies may be affected. Thank you to all Prom guests, parents, and chaperones for making this year's Prom enjoyable for everyone.

Dancing: Is to be in good taste. It may not be lewd or sexually suggestive, advocate violence, or threaten the safety of other students. Students who dance in any manner indicated above may be asked to leave the dance without a refund.

Prom Night Tips for Parents

Prom night can be stressful for parents. These tips will help you ensure a safe, worry-free evening.

- Make sure your child has a plan for the evening and that you know it.
- Know all of the "hot spot" destinations.
- Take stock of the alcohol in your home.
- Know who is driving -- if it's a limo, check their policy on no alcohol in the vehicle.
